Subject: The Holy Ghost:

The Holy Ghost is the third person in the trinity; it has different duties from that which the word of God has. It is the Holy Ghost that helps you to pray. Your prayers won't reach God unless the Holy Ghost carries them to God for you. You must be filled with the Holy Ghost to get the assistance that it offers. The Holy Ghost was commissioned by God to be an intercessor for those who are born again. There are many things we are not able to do unless the Holy Ghost helps us.

Praying is very important because it is a line of communication between man and God. God is Holy, and we cannot adjust our knowledge to the level of holiness that God accepts, therefore the Holy Ghost was given to help us. Without the assistance of the Holy Ghost we can't do very much that will be acceptable to God and that includes praying. There are many who pray and don't get an answer; that is because they don't have the assistance of the Holy Ghost. The Holy Ghost knows the will of God, and when it takes a prayer to God for us, it will only take prayers according to the will of God. When we don't know what to pray for it will make a request for us according to what God will grant. Sometimes we ask for things in prayer that will be to our disadvantage, so the Holy Ghost will disregard such prayers.

When you ask according to the will of God, you will get what you ask for, because you will be asking in Jesus' name. If you ask for a selfish purpose, you will not get what you ask for because that will be in your name. You are asking in Jesus' name when you ask according to what he teaches, to be used for the benefit of somebody other than yourself. When you ask in Jesus, name, you will do what He tells you to do with the blessings. There are no limitations to what God can give you, but there are limitations to your ability to manage.

The Lord will not withhold a blessing from you if you ask it in His name, but He knows your heart. You cannot lie to God in prayer about what you want a blessing for and use it for something different after you get it. It does not matter how loud you pray or moan or the fancy words you use in your prayers. You have to be led by the Spirit to pray.

The Lord's Prayer is always in order. The Holy Ghost makes utterances within you which the Lord interprets into a language (Romans 8:26). Unless someone who has the Holy Ghost prays for you, you have no help because your prayers won't go through. If your prayers are directed to God that you might be

able to accomplish something to the glory of God, and not to your own glory, then God will hear you. If you keep God's commandments so that He abides in you and you in Him, then you may ask what you will in His name with intentions of keeping it in His name using it to His glory, you will get what you ask for.

Subject: You Are Saved From The Company Of Unsaved Worshipers:

The knowledge of salvation is a mystery that has to be revealed to the human mind. You can only learn the secrets and mysteries of salvation by obeying God. A failure to repent of your sins and put forth an effort to obey God will result to you learning an erroneous teaching of salvation. Most churches teach an erroneous teaching of salvation.

The knowledge of the word of God is given to individuals and not church organization. The knowledge is designed to save a person, and not groups of people in a church. God chooses a person out of churches to save them. Listen to II Corinthians 13:5:

Verse 5 - Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; prove your own selves. Know ye not your own selves, how that Jesus Christ is in you, except ye be reprobates?

God calls His people out from among the majority. Listen to St. Matthew 20:16:

Verse 16 - So the last shall be first, and the first last: for many be called, but few chosen.

God will only save His people from a large church congregation, and not in a large church congregation. Listen to St. Matthew 7:13-14:

- Verse 13 Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat:
- Verse 14 Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that

find it.

God admonishes those who are called to be saved to come out from among those that He does not call. Listen to II Corinthians 6:14-17:

- Verse 14 Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?
- Verse 15 And what concord hath Christ with Belial? or what part hath he that believeth with an infidel?
- Verse 16 And what agreement hath the temple of God with idols? for ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will dwell in them, and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people.
- Verse 17 Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you.

God separates His people unto the gospel of Christ. You cannot be saved unless you are sanctified from unsaved worshipers. Listen to Romans 1:1:

Verse 1 - Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, separated unto the gospel of God.

When you get saved, the Holy Spirit calls you from among the unsaved and sanctifies you in Christ Jesus. You cannot be in Christ unless you are sanctified by the Spirit of God. Listen to I Corinthians 6:11:

Verse 11 - And such were some of you: but ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God.
