**Subject: What Is A Sinner?**

God is against sin, but He will help a sinner to repent. God is for a sinner who has a mind to turn from sin. A sinner is a person who disobeys God's commandments. He is a violator of what God stands for. A sinner is against God's holiness. God's holiness is His character. When you live free from sin, God categorizes you as being a saint. A saint is a holy person who is set apart from sinful practices.

If a person has a mind to repent from sin, God will help to make them a saint. In the kingdom of heaven, there will be only saints and angels living there.

**Subject: The Wages Of Sin Is Eternal Death, But The Gift From God Is Everlasting Life:**

When God warns the people of the world about the dangers that will overtake them for their disobedience to His word, God also shows signs to bear witness to His warnings. Five hundred and twenty-five years before Jesus was born into the world, God gave us warnings of the end of time. The final chapter of God's warnings is here.

The beginning of the last days started when Jesus was born in Bethlehem. Jesus was not sent just to be a minister to the people during his time, but He was sent to get us ready for the end of time. When time ends, eternity starts, and whatever condition the people are in at the end of time, they will be in the same condition forever. If a person is living in sin when time ends, they will remain in sin throughout eternity, suffering from the wages of sin. If a person is living free from sin when time ends, they will remain free from sin, living with God in heaven forever.

Death is the wages for sin in eternity; it will be the second death, which will be eternal torment. Everlasting life will be for the saved people in eternity, and it will be a gift from God for the saved. Listen to Romans 6:22-23:

Verse 22 - But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life.

Verse 23 - For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

**Subject: God Acknowledges A Repenting Heart:**

God sent the prophet Jonah to Nineveh to warn the people of Nineveh to repent. The King of Nineveh along with the people repented, and Nineveh was saved. Nineveh was an example of how God will keep His word and save a nation or an individual if they repent. To repent means to stop committing sin, because you are sorry for being a sinner. When repentance comes from the heart, God will accept and spare those who repent.

Manassas was the most wicked king that had ever ruled over Israel, and he became sick unto death. While he was sick he repented of his evil ways and prayed to God for forgiveness and God forgave Manassas of all his evil acts; if you go to heaven you will see Manassas there also. The stories on record in the Bible are for the benefit of future generations so that others will know how God will forgive their sins if they repent with a sincere heart.

**Subject: You Can Live Free From Sin:**

The Lord does not charge us for being a sinner because we are born in sin. He charges us for being a sinner if we continue to be a sinner. The gospel of Jesus Christ was sent to the earth by God for the purpose of making us aware of our sins, and what the results will be if we continue in sin.

Jesus was sent to bring to man the knowledge of the new way involving the new birth, which would set man free from sin. When you are free from sin, you will walk after the Spirit, and not after the flesh. To walk after the flesh it means that you will live for sinful pleasures. To walk after the Spirit means that you will live to obey God's word. Just because you are born in sin does not mean you have to stay in sin. You can enjoy a better life of righteousness by repenting of your sins, and living righteous.

Jesus has power to relieve us of the sinful state, and give us grace to enter into a spiritual state. If we decide in our hearts to obey God, we can find salvation that will enable us to live free from sin.

**Subject: Only Christ Can Deliver From Sin In The Flesh:**

We can repent of some sins, but we can't get our sins out ourselves: we must surrender our lives to God for Him to remove our sins. Only Jesus can operate on you to remove sin from your nature. When sin is in your nature, the very tendency to commit sin will be more powerful than your willingness to stop committing sin. When sin dwells in you it is not really you that do it, but sin that dwelleth in you. You may be very displeased with sin, but it doesn't care, it will make your body do it. Listen to Romans 7:17-20, 24-25:

Verse 17 - Now then it is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me.

Verse 18 - For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing: for to will is present with me; but how to perform that which is good I find not.

Verse 19 - For the good that I would I do not: but the evil which I would not, that I do.

Verse 20 - Now if I do that I would not, it is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me.

Only Christ can deliver you from sin that brings death to you.

Verse 24 - O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death?

Verse 25 - I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin.
